#### I. WELCOME

President – Craig Walter opened the meeting at 7:04 p.m.

#### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Kim Walts

## III. PRESIDENT'S REPORT – Craig Walter

- Meet Setup It was announced that a Tent Setup Volunteers are needed for the remaining 4 meets. Additionally, a chairperson will need to organize this task for next year's cross country season.
- Equipment Trailer Discussed the possibility of purchasing a trailer to store & haul CC equipment. Issues to investigate include insurance coverage, storage/parking location.
   Sam Van Scoyoc will make some calls to insurance agencies to find out about liability coverages.
- 501(c)3 Status The booster club has received full IRS approval of 501(c)3. The certificate verifying Tax Exempt Status takes approximately 90 days, so should be in hand by the end of the year.
- Middle School Meets
  - The previously used Middle School Meet course at Timbercreek now has several paved areas. We may need to move the course location so that it is more "cross country" and less "road race" style.
  - Bob Dubek interested in helping with the Meets which typically run from 4:30-7:00 for volunteers.
  - The first middle school meet will be on a Tuesday, the remaining three meets will be on Wednesdays.
  - Parent volunteers and student athlete volunteers will be needed to help at these meets. Dates, times & other details will follow at a later date.
- Flower Mound Invitational Meet Wrap Up
  - The FM Invite had fewer teams due to the number of other meets being held that same weekend.
  - Some schools do not like to have their girls run a 5K race. We will have the girls run a 2-mile course next year instead of a 5K.
  - May also consider opening the race to smaller school divisions if the city will allow us more hours on race day.
  - Discussion of the possibility of trying to make the FM Invite course the District race site. Coach Cook believes that both Hebron and Lewisville would vote for this also.
  - Possible construction issues could cause the course to be changed.
- Sponsorships Vicki Gulley and Scott Sanderson will Co-Chair this effort to bring in corporate sponsors now that the Booster Club has 501(c)3 certification. Sharon Fritts will email the existing form so that "Sponsor Levels" can be updated for use.

Current bank account balance is \$10,128.50.
